

# SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

The University of Miami School of Law is dedicated to helping students meet their educational expenses through loans, grants, and scholarships. In addition to scholarships from home country sources, students have the opportunity to be considered for the following sources of funding:

**DEAN'S MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS** Each year the University of Miami School of Law awards partial merit scholarships to entering students with excellent academic records and other outstanding qualifications for the graduate study of law. Dean's Scholarships are limited to full-time students and awarded at the time of admission to an LL.M. program. No separate application is required for the Dean's Scholarships; all admitted students are automatically considered for them.

## **One half-tuition scholarship is available to be awarded to a participant of the Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) Moot in Boston, MA.**

Participants must complete their application to any LL.M. program offered at the University of Miami School of Law by **February 15, 2018** to be considered for this scholarship. The scholarship will be awarded to one outstanding applicant based on an assessment of achievements and skills.

In addition, the \$50 application fee will be waived for any participant of the Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) Moot in Boston, MA who applies to any LL.M. program at the University of Miami School of Law through the University's Online Application System



# SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

The law school also has the ability to offer awards that are privately funded by alumni and others to help with financial support for graduate students. Awards are based on merit, need, and other factors. Some awards are **designated for specific LL.M. programs** as indicated below:

## White & Case/Carolyn B. Lamm Scholarship (for LL.M. in International Arbitration)

The University of Miami School of Law and White & Case LLP award one **full-tuition scholarship** to an outstanding applicant to attend the International Arbitration LL.M. Program. Students admitted to the International Arbitration LL.M. Program are **automatically** considered for this prestigious scholarship based on admission credentials, academic achievements, and promise.

## Young ICCA Scholarship (for LL.M. in International Arbitration)

The University of Miami School of Law and Young ICCA awards, one **full-tuition scholarship** to an outstanding Young ICCA member, to attend the International Arbitration LL.M. Program. The scholarship is awarded by an essay competition and an assessment of skills and academic achievements.

**By February 15** scholarship applicants must complete their application for admission and submit a written essay of at least 2,000 words, which should address **recent developments in international arbitration** in the applicant's home jurisdiction.

## International Arbitration Institute Scholarship (for LL.M. in International Arbitration)

The University of Miami School of Law's International Arbitration Institute (IAI) awards **one or more partial-tuition scholarships** to outstanding candidates to attend the International Arbitration LL.M. Program. Students admitted to the International Arbitration LL.M. Program are **automatically** considered for these prestigious scholarships based on admission credentials, academic achievements, and promise.

## Cobb Family Fellowship

The Cobb Fellowship was created by Charles E. Cobb, Jr., former Ambassador to Iceland and a member of the Board of Trustees. The Scholarship provides a living stipend for a graduate of the University of Iceland to study at the University of Miami School of Law for one year.
